The Diary of a 19th Century Farm Wife, Almira E. McCleary 1886, Written and Edited by William A. Cormier

Life on a potato farm was not easy and Almira tells about the trials and tribulations of a farm wife and inn keeper in 1886. Almira gives a unique picture of agriculture, the impact of the industrial revolution, transportation, religion and daily living in a patriarchal world. Next Year in Salem:

A Chronicle of the Home Front During WW II, 1940 - 1945, by William Al. Cormier

Researched over a period of six years, this 206 page hard cover book details Salem's part in World War II, describing the activities on the home and war fronts. Included is a chronology of the important local, county, state and national events of the times and of WW II land and sea battles. Many personal experiences are told for the first time, reflecting the spirit of the community and those who fought on the battlefronts. Fifty-seven rare pictures are included, plus an extensive 20-page name index, making the book an important historical and genealogy resource. This book has something for everyone. Salem Album, published by Dr. Asa Fitch Historical Society

This unique soft cover album contains over 240, 19th century and turn of the century photographs with text of Salem's past. Never before published, pictures of people, events, disasters, parades, buildings, vistas, street scenes, visually document life in Salem at that time. The historic pictures, taken by Salem photographers B. C. Kinney, Robert A. Cruikshank and others, represent early photography at its best. Price is \$10. The Back Shop and Other Tales, by William Al. Cormier

The 38-page soft cover manuscript is the only locally written history of railroading in Salem. The monograph, beginning in 1850, covers railroading on the Troy and Rutland Railroad and the Delaware and Hudson line that ran through the town of Salem until its demise in 1982. Personal stories of Salem men and others who worked for the T&R and the D&H detail early steam engine experiences: names of railroad workers, working conditions, equipment, blizzard of '88, train wrecks, fires, floods, fatal accidents, heroes, etc. The manuscript contains a computer generated map of the original Salem railroad yards and roundhouse circa 1890 as well as a map of the Washington County D&H lines in 1908. Tales and Legends From Salem, Edited by James Alcott, Editorial consultant, W. A. Cormier

Historic Salem, NY, settled almost 250 years ago, is rich in history and folklore. A new illustrated book - Tales and Legends From Salem - captures over 40 stories and vignettes from the area. They include "The Grey Man," Salem's guardian spirit, several other ghosts, a witch, the hideaway of Daniel Shays and his followers in the 1780's, Old Head Allen who was caught disinterring a body and separating its head for the advancement of medical science, and the story of a mysterious disappearance and a haunted chimney.
